



We have discovered that spiral illusions can be formed with the Café Wall illusion, the Zöllner illusion, and unpublished orientation illusions. This discovery suggests that the spiral illusion is not peculiar to the Fraser illusion.


Examples (Concentric circles appear to be spirals)




The Café Wall illusion




The illusion of shifted gradations




The illusion of striped cords







'The illusion of black-and-white circles' 'The illusion of striped squares'




The Zöllner illusion
